Introduction

During the COVID-19 pandemic and under the guidance to socially distance and isolate, women and children are at a greater risk of experiencing abuse, particularly at home. Stop VAW and all its members have a responsibility to ensure all programs, services and resources continue to be accessible and available to ensure women and their children can remain as safe as possible during this time. The following includes information about how to stay safe and the availability of services each member agency has to offer during this pandemic.



How to stay safe during COVID-19

Safety and emergency planning

- Create a safety plan: safety plans are unique plans that can be used to minimize harm to people living in situations where they are at risk for abuse. There are people available to help: Family Service Perth Huron VAW Services (519-273-1020), Optimism Place (519-271-5550), Victim Services Bruce Grey Perth (1-866-376-9852)
- Inform close friends or neighbours of the abuse going on. One way is to create a "code word" that when used in a call lets them know you are in danger.
- Stay in touch: Many people are feeling isolated at this time, but you are not alone. Use phone or video chats to keep in regular contact if it is safe to do so.
- Keep a copy of important documents (passports, birth certificates, driver's license, banking information, legal documents) in case it's needed. If not trusted in the home, consider keeping these with a trusted person.
- Plan where to stay in case of an emergency- supports you may have used could have different hours or policies at this time, friends or family may be quarantining due to illness. Check in with your support system just in case.

Crown Attorney's Office

The Crown Attorney's Office can be reached remotely by calling 226-921-5109.

Emily Murphy Centre

Counselling and support calls can be done via phone or skype. The office phone lines are forwarded to a cell phone that is monitored during business hours and beyond. The doors are locked, there are no visitors allowed at this time. The staff are working remotely. Emily Murphy Centre is working closely with Optimism Place to ensure that both agencies have what they need and can keep women and families safe. Donations can be accepted by calling 519-273-7350. Family Services Perth Huron

Family Services Perth-Huron Counselling department continues to serve clients through phone counselling. Clients of VAW, PAR and Partner Contacts programs continue to receive supports and phone safety check-ins. Intake continues during regular office hours, and is accepting referrals and new clients at this time. Huron Perth Children's Aid Society

CAS is still operating. Any child abuse concerns can be reported by phone. Contact is taking place by phone or video conference. Some contact can take place at a client's home or at the office with proper planning in certain situations where it is deemed appropriate. The Family Visiting Program is cancelled. Huron Perth Public Health

Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Perth County Detachment

Detachment locations in Sebringville, Mitchell, and Listowel are currently closed to the public. 24 hour emergency and non-emergency service <u>remains available</u> by telephone (1-888-310-1122), or 9-1-1 for emergencies. Each detachment location still provides 24hr direct access to our OPP Communications Centre via public telephones posted at the front entrance. Optimism Place

Optimism Place remains open and operational with service modifications in place. For all services contact 519-271-5550. This crisis line is open 24/7. Expanded Outreach Services by phone and video conferencing when it is safe to do so. Residential Shelter Services remain open for women at high risk with added cleaning and social distancing practices to ensure staff and residents' safety. Regional HIV/AIDS Connection

Carepoint (the safe injection site, or needle exchange program) is located at 186 King St. in downtown London and is open from 9am to 9pm with increased precautions. The Outreach Van (Counterpoint) for harm reduction supplies runs 11am - 6pm and will be doing door drop off only. The number for Counterpoint is 519-851-3548.
